The first half of the school year has been wonderful for the After School Learning Immersion Program. We are proud to announce that **fifty-three of our student made Honor Roll for the first nine weeks!**

We continue to try new things in order to provide an even better experience to students and parents. For example, PPDC is now utilizing Class Dojo software to monitor student behavior and communicate more effectively with parents. To emphasize the importance of higher education and to get students excited about learning, each classroom has adopted a college/university and decorated their rooms with college paraphernalia.

We continue to expose students to unique experiences, which compliment their academics. Twelve PPDC students are currently participating in an outdoor adventure club, through a partnership with **Blue Sky Fund**. Our 5th grades are learning the importance of healthy eating thanks to **Bon Secours' Class-A-Roll** program. **Anthem Blue Cross Blue Shield** is promoting a healthy lifestyle to 4th grade students with their Catch Healthy Habits program.
