## **Stephanie and Michael Present at National Conference**

At the end of June, Information Coordinator Michael Parsons and Director of Education Dr. Stephanie Bassett traveled to Portland, Oregon, to present before a national audience at the Northwest Evaluation Association's (NWEA) Fusion Conference.

NWEA is the creator of Measures of Academic Progress (MAP), the student assessment system utilized by Peter Paul. MAP is commonly adopted by school systems across the United States; however, Peter Paul is one of the only after school programs in the country to use the assessment. Because of the unique way that Peter Paul utilizes MAP, specifically in collaboration with Richmond Public Schools, NWEA invited Peter Paul to submit



a second conference proposal (Stephanie and Executive Director Damon Jiggetts traveled to Florida last fall to present as well). Peter Paul remains the only after school program in the country to present at this conference.

Their presentation, titled "Accelerate Your Impact: Forging MAP Partnerships with After School Partners," showed participants how they could *accelerate* their school system's impact by

harnessing and aligning the efforts of existing after school programs through a MAP data-sharing partnership. Peter Paul's after school program collaborates with the Richmond Public School system and uses MAP data to support students and remove some of the burden from public school teachers and administrators.

Stephanie shares, "I was excited about two things:

- To share how Peter Paul utilizes MAP data to support student academic progress. Being able to demonstrate how partnerships can be developed to support student progress can be a powerful tool.
- Learning new ways to support our students here at Peter Paul. For example, I can't wait to implement one strategy gained with multi-age groupings."

Of the experience, Michael says, "I was excited to share the work that Paul Paul and Richmond Public Schools has been engaged in together with school systems from all across the country. I hope that others can learn from our collaborative model and that more school systems begin to see after school programs as an important component of their students' education."



The collaborative model that both Stephanie and Michael mention is depicted here, which is a graphic that the two utilized during their presentation. Ultimately, we collaborate for the benefit of our **students**. We are grateful to NWEA for the opportunity to present Peter Paul's unique model on a national stage!

volunteer master gardeners) worked with the Peter Paul students to pick fresh produce from our garden to use in the Jr. Iron Chef cooking class on Friday!

Students have been reading "Charlotte's Web" this summer - the entire Peter Paul student body reads the same book. This one-book concept provides dialogue between students of different ages, engages volunteers as reading buddies, and allows teaching staff to be creative in bringing literacy to life through art projects and more. Peter Paul 2nd graders finished the book last week - as a finale, they created spider webs with crayon and water colors, picking one of the story's characters to write out character trait descriptions!
