EDUCATE THE CHILD: YOUTH PROGRAM

Our education programs supported an unduplicated 277 East End students in grades 2-12 during the 2016-2017 fiscal year, representing 222% of fiscal year 2013-2014's enrollment (total students in that year was 125).

The Youth Program is comprised of two components: After School Learning Immersion Program and Summer Promise. Together, these programs provide year-round academic support for students in Richmond's East End.

AFTER SCHOOL LEARNING IMMERSION PROGRAM

The After School Learning Immersion Program was offered at three locations during the 2016-2017 school year (the program's ninth year): Central, Fairfield Court Elementary School, and Woodville Elementary School. The Woodville Elementary School program operated in partnership with the YMCA of Greater Richmond. A total of 245 students attended the after school program across all three sites.

- 113 students in grades 2-12 attended the program at Peter Paul Central five days per week.
- 64 students in grades 2-5 attended the program at Fairfield four days per week.
- 68 students in grades 2-5 attended the program at Woodville five days per week.

SUMMER PROMISE

At Peter Paul, we know that summer instruction is critical to eliminating summer learning loss. The eight-week Summer Promise program provides students with a wide variety of

educational and enrichment activities that ensure their continued education. For the second year in a row, we were able to host an off-site location of the Summer Promise program at Fairfield Court Elementary School, ensuring students in the Peter Paul @ Fairfield Court Elementary After School program also had access to summer programming. A total of 124 students in grades 2-12 attended the 2016 Summer Promise program at Central or Fairfield Court Elementary School.

SCHOOL DAY

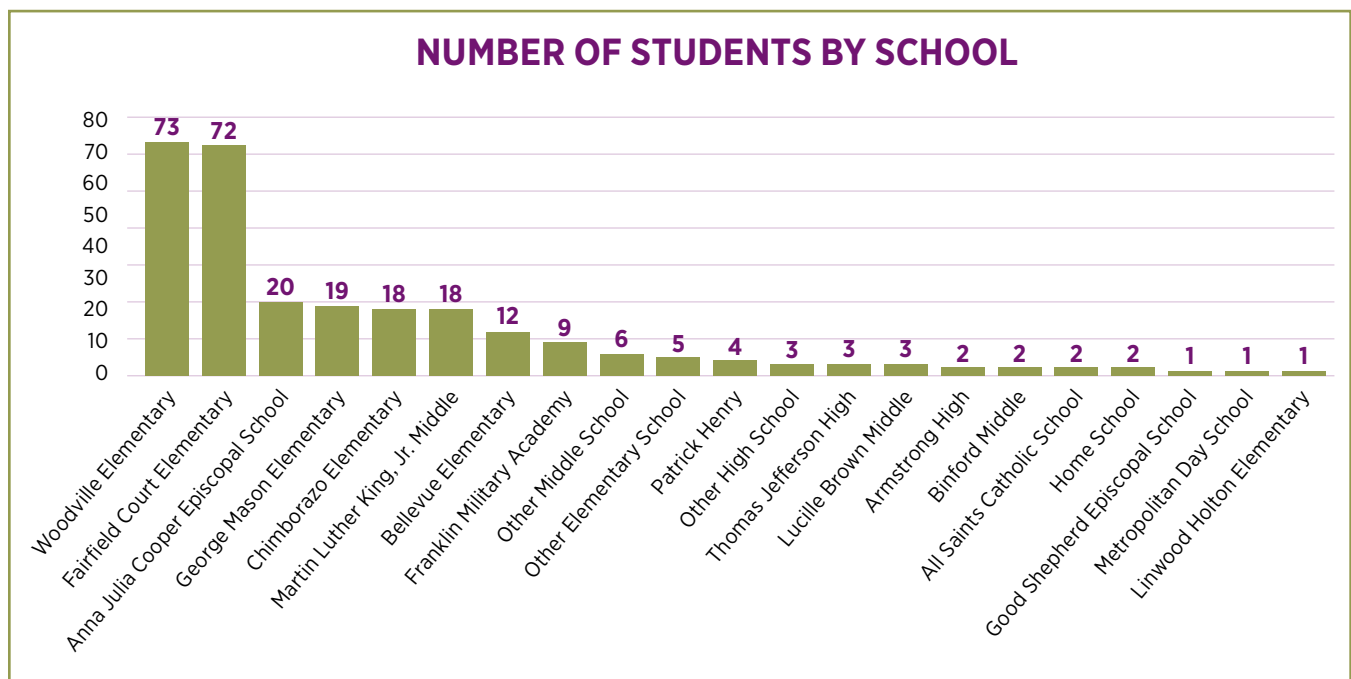
Peter Paul recognizes that the school day and after-school day are inexorably linked. Our program works because we do not operate in isolation. Instead, we work in partnership with our students' individual schools and the wider school system.

Peter Paul is thankful for its strong, collaborative partnership with Richmond Public Schools (RPS). The After School Learning Immersion Program is designed to complement and support the great work done during the school day by RPS teachers and administrative staff. Many of the Peter Paul after school staff are employed during the day as RPS teachers.

DAY SCHOOLS

While all students reside in the East End, in the past year students came to Peter Paul from more than 20 different schools.

EDUCATE THE CHILD: YOUTH PROGRAM

ACADEMIC GROWTH

Peter Paul is a leader in developing innovative and individualized academic supports for students. Every Peter Paul student is tested using Northwest Evaluation Association's Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment.

Staff use this information to tailor an academic plan for each student. Certified or experienced teachers in small classroom settings (14 students, one teacher, and one program assistant) then administer the academic plan (called a P-PEP or Peter-Paul Educational Plan). Students at Peter Paul are supported by math and reading specialists, one-on-one mentors, and academic tutors as needed.

In 2016-2017, Richmond Public Schools (RPS) began testing students across the district using MAP. Peter Paul and RPS have established an innovative partnership allowing testing data to be shared with after school staff. This ensures that the Peter Paul student testing load is decreased, and for the first time, school day teachers and after school staff are using the very same data and benchmarks to help students achieve individualized growth. Peter Paul and RPS were recently selected by the Virginia Partnership for Out-of-School-Time to host a workshop at their annual conference in 2017, demonstrating how school systems and after-school programs can build collaborative data-sharing partnerships. Peter Paul has also been selected by the Northwest Evaluation Association to present a similar workshop at their national Fusion Education Conference in Florida in November 2017.

Students at Peter Paul are achieving great academic progress.

- 94% of students showed improvement in at least one subject (math or reading) during the 2016-2017 academic year. This represents a **5% increase** over the preceding school year.*
- 59% of students met their individual growth projection in at least one subject (math or reading). This represents a **13% increase** over the preceding school year.
- 55% of students exceeded their individual growth projection in at least one subject (math or reading) during the 2016-2017 academic year. This represents a **17% increase** over the preceding school year.
- More than 99% of Peter Paul's public school students were promoted to the next grade level after the 2016-2017 school year. This remains unchanged from the preceding school year.

**Growth projections are calculated by the MAP assessment, based on individual skill level and norming studies conducted by the Northwest Evaluation Association.*



SCHOOL BEHAVIOR

We are able to see the impact of our school collaboration when looking at the behavior of students who also attend Peter Paul's After School Program.

- 81% of students at Peter Paul last year displayed good school behavior, with no days of school missed due to suspension or expulsion.
- At the three schools with the largest Peter Paul populations, students who complete the Peter Paul program appear *more likely* to display good behavior (no suspension or expulsions) than the general student body by 10-13%.

98% of parents believe that attending Peter Paul has helped their student do better in school.

95% of parents believe that attending Peter Paul has helped their student improve his or her behavior.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

When a child misses school, they miss an opportunity to learn. That is why attendance is such a priority at Peter Paul. Chronic absence (missing 18 or more days of school for *any reason*) can cause students to fall behind in school, negatively impact mastery of reading skills, and jeopardize high school completion.

Peter Paul requires students to be present daily. If students miss school during the day, they cannot come to our programming. In this way, we support and encourage students to attend school every day. Over the past school year, 90% of Peter Paul students had good school attendance. We will work with those students to make sure that their attendance improves next year.

YOUTH PROGRAM

STUDENT ATTITUDES AND BELIEFS

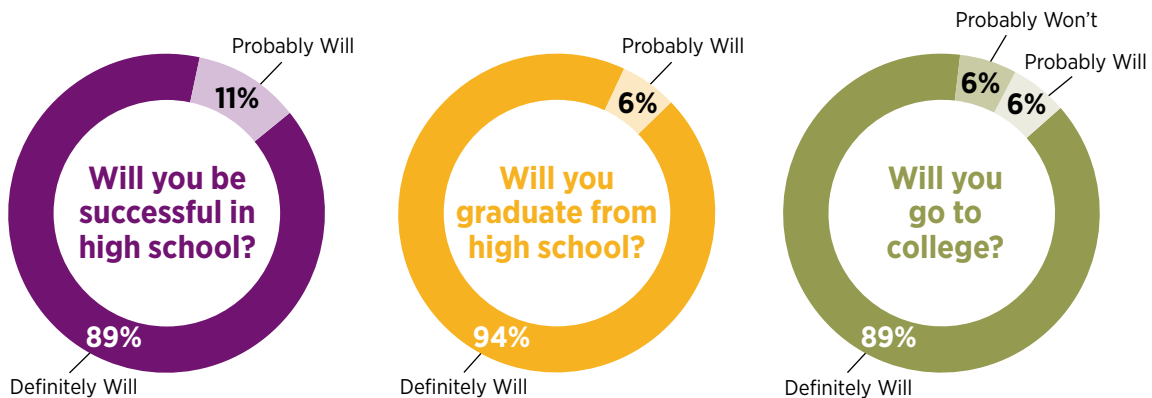
Peter Paul uses the Survey of Academic and Youth Outcomes, a nationally recognized tool, which provides us a valid and reliable assessment of our 4th through 8th grade students. The survey is administered anonymously and students are empowered to provide honest and accurate feedback so that the program can continue to improve.

Connecting After School with the School Day: Peter Paul students see a strong connection between their time spent in the program and their academic success.

- 67% of students reported that coming to Peter Paul has “helped them do better in math.”
- 2 out of 3 students believe that coming to Peter Paul helps them both “try harder” and “do better” in school.

Growing Expectations for the Future

- Our middle school students continue to have high expectations for their futures.



OUR FAMILIES

Peter Paul families come from all over the East End community. Nearly three out of four Peter Paul households live in one of the four public housing communities that encircle the East End. Two-thirds of our families are single-parent households and the vast majority of households are raising families well below the poverty line. Each family is different and each one brings unique strengths and talents to the program.

OUR PARENTS

We could not operate the program without the continuous support and leadership of our parents. They are equal partners with Peter Paul staff in the education and development of students.

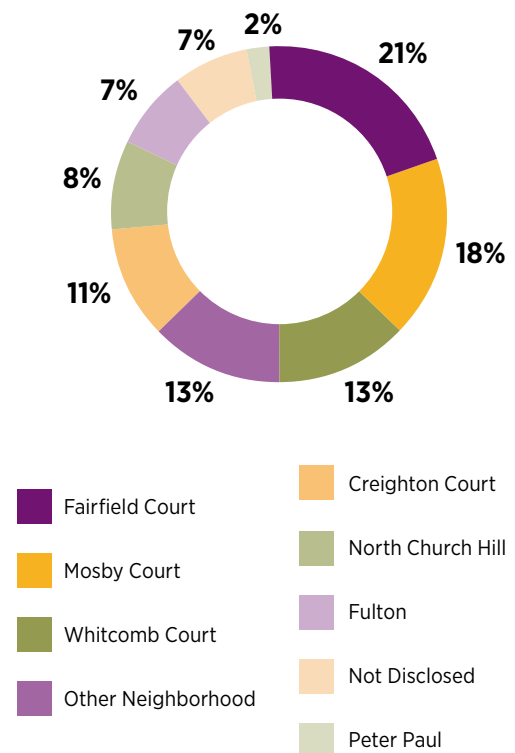
- During the last school year an incredible 81% of students had a parent or guardian voluntarily come out and attend a family or community event hosted by Peter Paul.*
- More than half of students had a parent or guardian volunteer at Peter Paul in 2016-2017.

Families find value in Peter Paul year after year.

- 69% of eligible students returned to the program between the 2015-2016 academic year and the 2016-2017 academic year.

*Parent engagement outcomes were calculated based upon students who attended either Peter Paul Central or PPDC @ Fairfield Court Elementary School since at least December 2016. Students attending PPDC @ Woodville Elementary were excluded due to site-specific barriers to volunteering.

ENGAGE THE FAMILY: PROMISE FAMILY NETWORK

The Promise Family Network is becoming a staple of support for parents at Peter Paul and the East End community at-large. As parents willingly join this network of parents they enhance their ability to create healthy family environments.

Advantages for joining this Network are:

- Strong focus on relationship building, including parenting
- Positive peer-to-peer support amongst neighborhood parents
- Consistent belief in the power of resiliency
- Ongoing learning and development for both parents and children

Parents are now able to join the Network by committing to the creation of their family plan, and they are also encouraged to participate in Strengthening Families. As of Spring 2017, five cohorts (29 parents) have completed the evidence-based Strengthening Families Program, and many parents are working on reaching their goals. We work collaboratively within Peter Paul and amongst our Richmond Promise Neighborhood Community Action Network to support these families every step of the way.

Some of the parents who enter the Network are already Peter Paul parents, some are community members, and some enroll their students in the Peter Paul After School program after joining the Network.

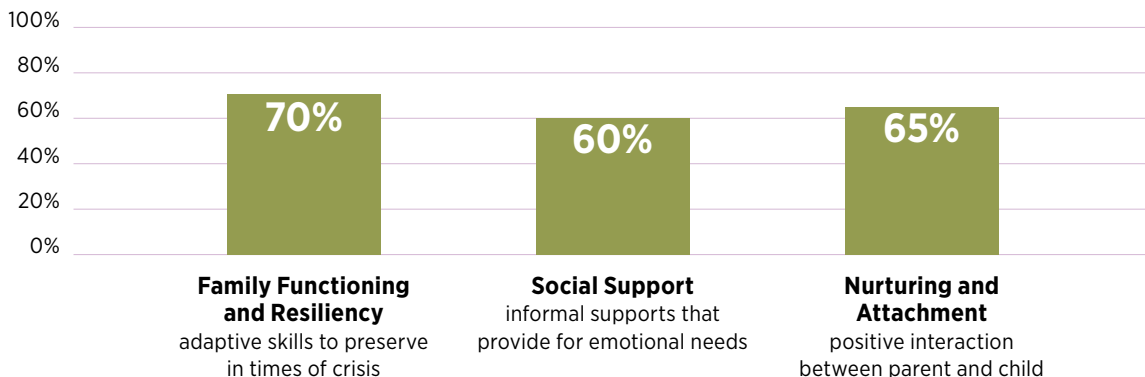
- 95% of parents report that membership in the Network helped them become a stronger parent.

Building Up Protective Factors

The Protective Factors Survey is a valid and reliable tool, which we use to measure protective factors in our families. Protective factors are negatively correlated with child abuse potential and stress, positively related to optimism and the adaptive coping strategy of positive reframing, and negatively related to depression. The families in the Promise Family Network are developing and strengthening their protective factors.

EMPOWER THE COMMUNITY: RICHMOND PROMISE NEIGHBORHOOD

RICHMOND PROMISE NEIGHBORHOOD COMMUNITY ACTION NETWORK

The Community Action Network is made up of the five Richmond Promise Neighborhood (RPN) Action Teams. These teams serve as the vehicles to rebuild layers of connection within the community and revive some of the hallmarks of traditional community. At the same time, they replace the more bureaucratic model of service delivery with one of resident empowerment, bottom-up decision-making, and evidence-based collaboration. Through our Action Teams, goal-directed East End residents are supported by the relationships and partnerships that we have established with approximately 40 organizations.

The Community Action Network:

- Is the first point of contact – the hub – for collaborative initiatives in the East End;
- Maintains continuous communication, a collaborative culture of transparency, and authentic relationships of trust, mutual respect, and common motivation; and,
- Implements the goals and objectives of the Peter Paul Board of Directors and the RPN Advisory Board.

Some of the key initiatives supported by the Community Action Network include:

- Supporting Smart Beginnings with its Kindergarten registration in East End schools.
- Advocating for increased parent engagement in East End schools.
- Enhancing the growth and development of the Promise Family Network.
- Championing trauma informed approaches in educational and community settings through the Promise Academy. In partnership with SCAN (Stop Child Abuse Now) and with Bon Secours, The Academy coordinated and hosted community trainings and movie screenings on adverse childhood experiences, trauma, and resilience.
- Integration of the 7th District Health & Wellness Initiative founded by Councilwoman Cynthia Newbille into the Community Action Network.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

RPN hosts East End community events to foster information sharing and relationship building and to provide a platform for community dialogue. At every RPN event, you will witness community members working side-by-side and hand-in-hand with volunteers and service providers to make events successful. All events are free and open to

Peter Paul families and to all East End community members. More than a thousand people attended Richmond Promise Neighborhood events in the past year. (Some of these people may have attended more than one event.) RPN partnered with more than 60 community programs to host its events.

4th Annual East End Community Field Day

Hundreds of families came together to have fun, to learn new things, and to “build community” on the large field outside Woodville Elementary School. The 2016 Field Day was supported by more than 60 organizations and groups, dozens of volunteers, and a dynamic planning team composed of people who live or work in the community.

Being a Good Neighbor Info Feast

People came out for a night of fun, fellowship, and information sharing and to celebrate the value of being a good neighbor. Community members and organizational partners designed fun, interactive activities for families to participate. At the conclusion of the Info Feast, guests used a text poll to vote on their favorite “Good Neighbor” t-shirt design and on one “Neighborhood Tradition” to strengthen the East End neighborhood.

Get Your Money, Honey Info Feast

We filled the gym with good energy, music, people, and information. This event offered community members education and resources on finances and money management. Partners provided information and programming to help folks set and achieve financial goals.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

Senior Citizens

In collaboration with the Senior Center of Greater Richmond, Peter Paul serves East End senior citizens with quality programming twice per week. Several of the seniors remember with fondness Peter Paul’s founder, John Coleman, as he began the seniors program and the program has continued for decades. The dynamic partnership with the Senior Center of Greater Richmond ensures that their expertise of working with senior citizens is the core component of the thriving program. Seniors participate in Zumba, yoga, bingo, arts and crafts, field trips, and so much more! There were 58 senior citizens involved in programming at Peter Paul in 2016-2017.

Food Distribution

Peter Paul has continued its partnership with FeedMore to distribute food twice-monthly to residents in the 23223 and 23231 zip codes. In the past year, 4,432 cumulative individuals were served through the distribution program (some individuals would have participated in the program multiple times). Of these individuals, 1,384 were children, 1,975 were adults, and 1,073 were seniors.

2016-2017 REVENUE & EXPENSES

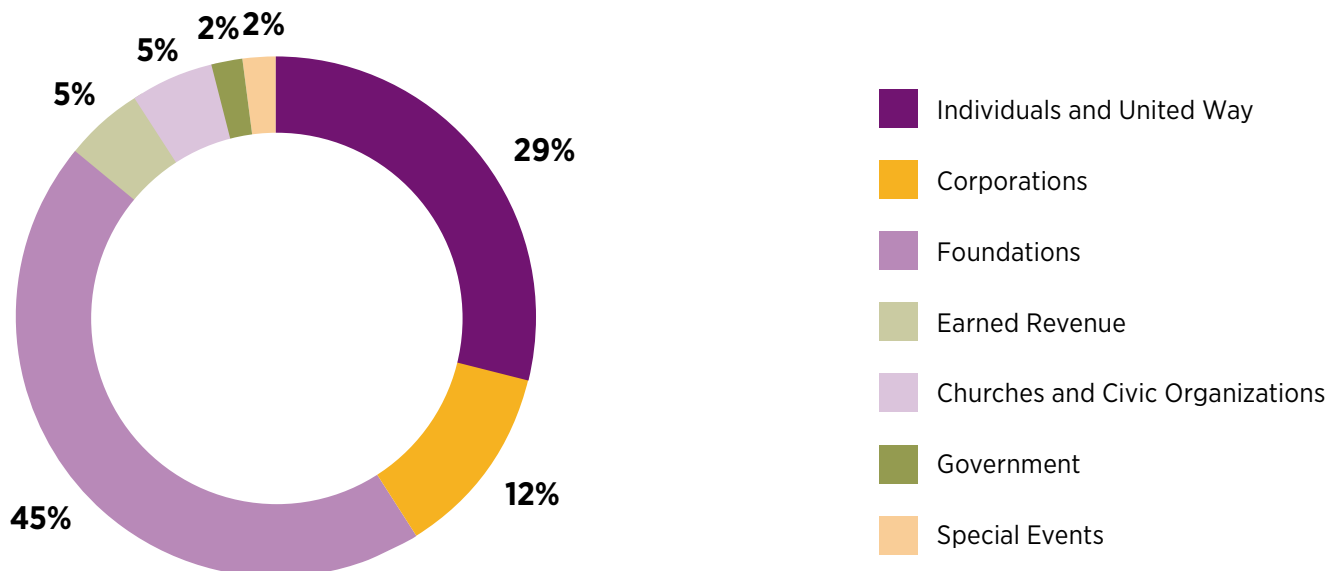
Peter Paul has contracted an audit prepared by independent accountants. As of the date of printing the 2016-2017 Annual Report, the financial information presented has not been audited. Also to note in the 2016-2017 fiscal year, Peter Paul received two extraordinary one-time grants from two foundations. One grant is intended for programming in the 2017-2018 fiscal year. The second grant is board-designated as a reserve fund for short-term investing.

CAMPAIGN FOR THE CHILDREN OF RICHMOND'S EAST END

The *Campaign for the Children of Richmond's East End* has made an incredible difference for Peter Paul and its service delivery in so many ways – program and building growth, as well as debt reduction and an infusion in the David T. Anderson Endowment for Youth Education. By the end of the *Campaign* pledge period, Peter Paul will be able to eliminate its entire debt, refocusing these debt payments on programming for greater impact in our community.

The most visual part of the *Campaign* is the incredible building addition! The new 5,000 square feet of space doubled the number of classrooms available, and grew the number of students we can serve on-site from 90 to 160. The building addition was complete and students moved into the space in mid-December 2016. The flexibility of the classrooms, the space, and the new configuration makes 21st Century learning come to life – teachers can freely set-up their classrooms for the day's lessons with rolling tables that can accommodate any classroom configuration needed. 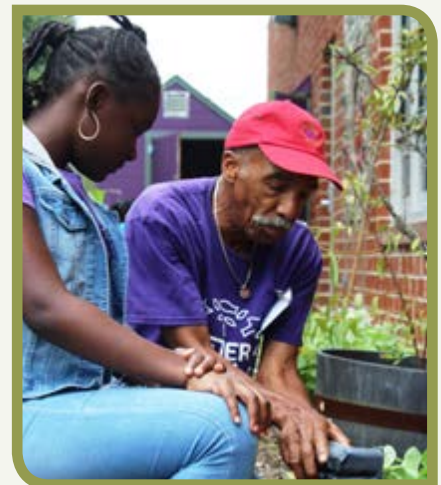
