Rent-to-Own Program Partnership

Peter Paul is proud to partner with the Maggie Walker Community Land Trust, Urban Hope, and ReWork Richmond on an exciting new housing project! MWCLT's Homeownership Bridge Program aims to promote inclusive homeownership by setting aside homes specifically for would-be buyers who do not currently qualify for a mortgage, be it due to a low credit score or an inability to afford a down payment or pay closing costs. Through the program, families are able to lease a home until they are "mortgage ready".

Once constructed, Urban Hope will manage the property, and Peter Paul and ReWork will be identifying potential families for the property built adjacent to our Coleman Promise Center. Check out this recent article in <u>Richmond</u> <u>Bizsense</u> to learn more.

The Peter Paul Promise Center Youth Program at <u>MLK</u> is an enrollment-based program for students in grades 2-8 whose parents or caregivers are teachers, essential workers or live in the East End.

This in-person support for students and families provides:

- Structured academic support and technical support in alignment with Richmond Public Schools' virtual instructional day
- Safe transition between classes, assignments, brain breaks, and lunch
- Adapted version of Peter Paul's signature after-school enrichment program with activities including STEM, health and wellness, and the arts
- Breakfast, lunch, and late afternoon snack
- Transportation to and from MLK in the mornings and afternoons

What grades did you attend Peter Paul as a student? "I attended Peter Paul between about 4th-8th grade. My older brother also attended!"

What have you been up to since then? "I've really just been working my way around the city while getting to know both Richmond and myself. I did some culinary school after high school then started working here and there. In the last few years, I've been able to find real passion and enjoyment in cooking so now I'm just seeing where that takes me."

Favorite Peter Paul memory? "I wouldn't say I had ONE favorite memory in particular but just memories of some of our big trips everyone looked forward to like Water Country and Skateland. Also just being able to hang out with other kids in a safe and positive environment. When I was there, Mr. Beechaum, Ms. Hawks, and Mrs. Jones were running things and they were great.
