






Z-LIFE cohort spotlight



The racial reckoning and social unrest of last summer led them to the Community Foundation, where their staff connected them with leaders of local organizations whose missions aligned with Bill and Charlotte's passions. "This is how the couple learned about Peter Paul, a Black-led community-based agency with centers throughout Richmond's East End that provides out-of-school-time programming for students, plus intentional family and community engagement." their teachers or the resources at their school, and Peter Paul works to make sure students have support from all angles."

We are excited to continue highlighting organizations that are doing amazing work in the Richmond community! This month, we're highlighting *Rise For Youth*. Check them out below:



RISE (Re-Invest in Supportive Environments) for Youth is a nonpartisan organization committed to dismantling the youth prison model and ensuring every space that impacts a young person's life encourages growth and success. "RISE promotes the creation of healthy communities and community-based alternatives to youth incarceration. Our work centers youth and their communities who together, challenge racial and social injustice in Virginia.

RISE serves more than 1000 youth per year through our programming and our legislative and community advocacy. For example, we worked with youth and communities to pass

HB1912 which ended the collection of child support from families whose youth were transferred into the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice upon incarceration. Our programming includes our Youth for RISE Advocacy Network and our Youth Development Academy which are two of our programs providing direct advocacy, mentorship, life skills, and employment opportunities. We educate and encourage youth to have agency over the very systems that have, in many instances, negatively impacted their lives.

Upcoming event:

We are preparing for our **5**th **annual Justice Parade**! It will be virtual again this year and later in the fall, so stay tuned to learn more and find out how you can get involved!"
